There is no way that a person can fully appreciate all that she has been for this congregation and all that she has given to its life and ministries. Pastors are a lot alike in their gifts and shortcomings. Barb's call to ministry began with a realization that her gifts addressed those common gaps. The greatest of these is that she is an excellent administrator. She has a knack for seeing the right questions and details. There is little at Resurrection in which she has not had a direct role.

But what makes her such an asset is her diversity in ministry. Like many administrators, she can sometimes be a little too direct, but as most of us know, she is also excellent at ministering to others. Her strong emotional and relational awareness and her gift as a listener makes her a person in whom others naturally confide. What's more, she is also a capable worship leader. It is not her calling and the thought of preaching makes her physically ill, but she'll lead worship, read a sermon, preside at communion, and is not above cracking out a Dr. Sues book for a children's sermon. She has been the one at the back of the sanctuary on Sunday mornings tying up loose ends and identifying guests; the person to call for some bit of information; the shepherd of small groups; and an invaluable part of the day Pastor Smith -to-day running of Resurrection.

In the end Resurrection is Jesus' church, and it will continue to grow and shine even without Barb. We will continue to do the intentional planning and work to raise up Resurrection's ministry priorities as well as the volunteer, paid staff, and rostered positions they will

HOWEVER General OPERATING OFFERINGS are Lower than planned, over the past several months have used Working Capital to fill void. However the Checking Account (Operating) at ~\$0.0 K.

The members of the Council have approved the use to borrowing from restricted accounts to pay the general operating expenses. This is not our wish; however, it is currently a must effective late September 2023.

2023 Lutheran Social Services Cup of Kindness Christmas Program.

With the significant rise in cost of basic needs, such as housing and utilites, Lutheran Social Services of Indiana (LSSI) has changed the Christmas Program model. The Christmas Family gift and gift card donations did not address families most significant needs. This Christmas, LSSI is asking congregations to make cash donations to the Cup of Kindness Program. By donating to Cup of Kindness, LSSI staff will be able to provide more families with utility payments to ensure electricity and water stay on, or provide them a rent or mortgage payment. Families in need are identified through referrals from social-service agencies and Lutheran congregations. The Cup of Kindness Program offers supportive services to these families through case management, financial-literacy education and/or financial assistance to help them move toward financial stability. LSSI is committed to helping families improve their financial futures. They do this by integrating financial education into all programs. Financial education offers families an opportunity to understand and manage their finances, enabling them to take steps to create a secure and independent financial future.

A donation box will be located at the welcome center for your contributions beginning November 5th and ending December 10th.
